John Johnson, a free white man, and a native of *Sweden*, comes into Court and produces

the certificate of the Clerk of the *two witnesses proving to the court* showing that on the *10* day of *October*

1857, he declared his intention before the *said Clerk of said court* to become a citizen of the United States, and took the oath required by the act of Congress, passed on the fourteenth day of April, 1802, entitled "An Act to establish a uniform rule of Naturalization and to repeal the Acts heretofore passed on the subject;" and, also, proves to the satisfaction of the Court by the oath of *Olof Johnson* and *Jacob Jacobson*

two credible citizens of the United States that he has resided within the United States five years, and within the State of Illinois one year; and that during that time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and is well disposed to the good order and government of the same. And thereupon the said *John Johnson* declares on oath, that he will support the Constitution of the United States; and that he doth absolutely and entirely renounce and abjure all allegiance and fidelity to every foreign Prince, Potentate, State or Sovereignty, whatever, and particularly to *the King of Sweden* whereof he was before a subject.
